# HOW WAS YOUR DONATION SPENT?

Every year, we give donors the opportunity to decide what area of our work they wish to support. Here is where the funds raised in 2012/13 were allocated:

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## Greatest need (£93,683)

We are very grateful for unrestricted donations to the Annual Fund, which give The Courtauld the flexibility to spend the money where the need is greatest.

This year, donations given to the greatest need were combined with donations to the Gallery (£923) and contributed to a vitally important project to upgrade and replace extensive parts of the Gallery's environmental control plant. The plant was installed in 1999 and much of it had reached the end of its working life – not surprising, given that it operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week! This major project aimed to replace failing equipment, thereby improving our ability to maintain the appropriate conditions for our works of art and those on loan to us, and secondly to build resilience into the system. The main bulk of the work took place this summer and autumn; it involved replacing all 32 existing room conditioning units in the Gallery itself, which required a rolling programme of room closures, plus the significant task of installing modern equipment into the challenging spaces of a Grade 1 listed building.

This project is nearly finished and once it is completed The Courtauld Gallery will have a robust system which will provide the best possible conditions for our world-class collections for the next decade and beyond.



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## Scholarships (£5,304)

This year, Serena Martucci di Scafrizzi, a PhD student from Italy in the Wall Paintings Conservation department, received support from the Annual Fund scholarship.

Serena is in the final year of her doctoral research and is currently completing her thesis, entitled "Islamic Wall Paintings in Spain: A Comparative Study from 711-1492". The last twelve months have been critical to her research and she recently travelled to Murcia, Granada, Cordoba and Seville to visit sites dating to the Almoravid, Almohad and Nasrid dynasties. She also travelled to Egypt in November 2012 where she surveyed a range of important wall paintings and decorations in monuments from the Mamluk sultanate in Cairo, the capital of the Mamluk empire.

## Conservation (£2,032)

This year, donations to the Conservation department were allocated to the repairs and maintenance budget for the equipment in the Conservation laboratories, thus supporting the core running of the department. It is crucial that our Conservation equipment is maintained to a high standard so that we can provide the best training for our students. Vital maintenance this year included the retouching lights, humidifiers and our lining table.



## Libraries (£1,884)

The money donated to The Courtauld's libraries was used to purchase a selection of catalogues raisonnés, including: 'The paintings of Hendrick Goltzius 1558-1617: a monograph and catalogue raisonné'; 'Jan van Kessel der Ältere 1626-1679'; and 'Fernand Léger: catalogue raisonné', 2 volumes. These catalogues raisonnés are an incredibly valuable resource for Courtauld students, enabling them to study the complete oeuvres of artists, and also to research the provenance and attribution of individual artworks.



## Teaching and Research (£1,011)

This year, donations for teaching and research funded single day study trips for MA students. The locations of the study trips included a visit to the Sandham Memorial Chapel, a crucial element in looking at the range of paintings memorialising World War One; a visit to The Henry Moore Foundation at Perry Green, including a tour of the studios and sculptures in the grounds, which is an important trip for students of British Sculpture; and a visit to the Essex Collection of Art from Latin America at the University of Essex. These study trips are an integral part of the Masters programme, enabling students to expand their learning outside The Courtauld.

## HOW MUCH WAS DONATED IN 2012/13?

For the academic year beginning on the 1 August 2012 and ending on the 31 July 2013, The Courtauld Annual Fund received donations from 520 donors totalling £104,838.62. This included £11,109.75 of tax reclaimed from Gift Aid.

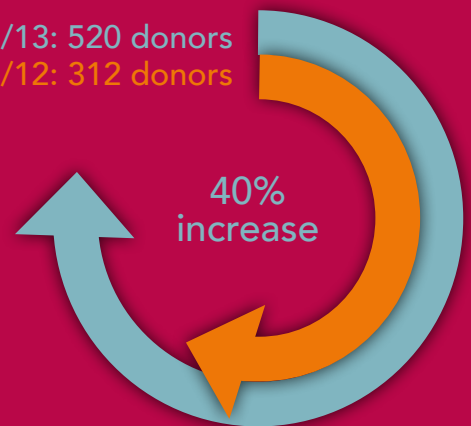

2011/12: 312 donors



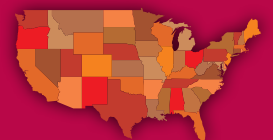

We were delighted with some of the feedback and information from the telethon campaign, and the following is just a small sample: One alumna was pleased to hear about our public education programmes as she was from a state school and herself had only heard of The Courtauld from a newspaper in her dentist waiting room! Another explained that he really appreciated being contacted and spoken to directly, and with an interest in what he had been doing, rather than simply receiving a letter or a blind phone call. Yet another said it was good to speak to someone who fully understood what the funds were needed for.

The students reached 573 individuals over the period and alumni and Friends made generous gifts which totalled an amazing £58,748 pledged over five years.
